Pupils that are identified as having a learning need may receive 1:1 sessions or small group work and a pupil passport can be created. This is shared with all teachers to meet pupils needs in the classroom.

Prior to The Unicorn School, Mel worked at Mabel Prichard school with PMLD students and has gained a lot of experience working with those with ASD. In her spare time, Mel enjoys going to the gym.
